Creativity	10%	 Material is presented in a concise yet engaging way. Content is original. Suitable use of graphics, figures, visuals. If necessary, multimedia, visual, or physical aids available (e.g., demos). Poster is eye-catching.
Approachable Poster is audience- friendly	10%	 It is easy to determine what the poster is about by just glancing at it. Poster is not busy (e.g., too much prose or looks like sections of a paper have been copy-pasted into it, or paragraphs of text). There is a good balance between images and text. Images are reasonably sized; they are not blurry and colors are used as appropriate. Used readably, consistent fonts. E.g., Title > 72 pt; Headings >40 pt; Body text > 28 pt; Captions > 24 pt Font type is easy to read, and colors are not "offensive" to the sight (e.g., red over green).
