- is the domination of one group or state over others
- with or without direct force
- tries to explain how and why dominant groups are able to keep their power

 but well maintained.

The Fascist Legacy

- 33 million death
- 6 million European Jews killed
- 13 million Soviets, 6 million Poles, 1.4 million Yugoslavs, 500 000 British, 300 000 Americans.

In Germany:


50 % of large cities destroyed

Denazification

- May 8, 1945: 8 Mio. Members of NSDAP in Germany.
- Western Allies: Focus on individual and collective guilt => retribution
- Soviet Union: Focus on capitalism as the source of nazism => securing communist power



General Lucius Clay

American Military Commander 1945

"our major administrative problem was to find reasonably competent Germans who had not been affiliated or associated in some way with the Nazi regime ... All too often, it seems that the only men with the qualifications...are the career civil servants...a great proportion of whom were more than nominal participants (by our definition) in the activities of the Nazi Party".

West

- Establishing parties
- Free elections
- Strengthening federalism
- Licensing media

East

- Unifying parties under communist rule
- Manipulated elections
- Abolishing federalism
- Censoring media



Marshall Plan



- Truman doctrin
- European Recovery Program:13.8 billion
- Germany gets 10 %
- Jump starts the economy





East

- Severe Soviet reparations
- Collectivizing agriculture, industry, health care
- Establishing workers brigades
- Five year plans
- Strong welfare

 Yet also: Economic miracle East

West

- Light Western allied reparations
- Decartellization
- Public ownership of water, electricity, transportation and communication infrastructure
- Welfare states
