What we look for is...

- Clarity and efficiency of argument
- Evidence provided
- Sources used
- Writing style
- References cited



Grading criteria will include

- Sophistication of analysis:
- do you state the main issues related to the question and analyze them by including substantial evidence and examples?
- Depth of research:
- Have you identified additional sources for your argument? I.e. books, articles, statistics surveys



Grading criteria -2

Writing:

- Is the flow of your argument clear and coherent?
- Are you using adequate scientific terms? Do you explain them where needed?
- Have you edited your texts properly and quoted accurately?
- Form: Make sure the essays correspond with our formal requirements.



The No-No's

- Wikipediazation, using ONLY internet sources
- Using obscure internet sources
- Repetition
- Unsubstantiated points
- Quoting without referencing
- Buying essays online
- Plagiarism (check for definition on website).
