





Japanese syllables


- Five vowels
- Two syllabic consonants
- Consonant + Vowel
- Each syllable is represented by a Kana
 - Hiragana ... used in ordinary writing
 - Katakana ... limited use (to be discussed later)


Hiragana for Vowels















