Japanese Sentence

- Important thing to remember
 - Verb/Predicate comes at the end of a sentence
 - Verb/Predicate alone can make a sentence
- The copula
 - *Desu* (pronounced as “de-ssss”)
 - Noun+*desu*
 - Ohta desu. “I am Ohta.”
 - Sensee desu. “S/he is a teacher.”
 - すし desu. “It is sushi.”

Noun *desu*.

- Things/People you are talking about:
 - _____ wa
 - Obama-san wa Amerika jin desu.
 - Sashihara-san wa Nihon jin desu.
 - Jaa (“then”), Chen-san wa?
 - Jaa, Psy-san wa?

How to ask a question in Japanese?

- If you are already talking about something (say, nationality of a group of people).
- Following a statement about one person,
 - E.g. Obama-san wa Amerika jin desu.
 - Simply, (Jaa) _____ wa? (with a rising intonation)



Rola-san

How to ask a question in Japanese?

- If no preceding statement...
 - Attach か at the end of the sentence (with a rising intonation)
 - おおた sensee wa Nihon jin desu.
... declarative sentence
 - おおた sensee wa Nihon jin desu か。
... question sentence

Another method of Confirming the Correctness of what you are thinking:

- End the sentence with ne.

Obama-san-wa
Amerikajin desu
NE.



How to answer the question?

- Yes (that's the case).
 - はい。 Or ええ。
 - はい、 soo desu/ええ soo desu.
- No (that's not the case).
 - いいえ。
 - いいえ、 soo ja arimasen.
