<p>Migrants uninformed about policies, regulations and legal rights</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Migrants ignore laws and don't use services available to them 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Disseminate information to bridge the gap between official objectives of regulating migration and migrants' survival strategies that often ignore regulations
<p>Factories come to make profits and migrants come to make more money and gain new skills here, moving them towards achieving life goals at home</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Companies build self-contained factories and workers make money at the expense of local living environment 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Integrate companies and worker with the community
<p>Resources for migrant families limited (i.e. housing, schooling)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Breakdown of family structure (i.e. children left in place of origin, children left unattended if here) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Accommodate the housing and welfare needs of diverse types of migrant families
<p>Discrimination (i.e. in education fees, from local residents)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Feeling of alienation discouraging community involvement 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Overcome the differential access to service and treatment of migrants
<p>Difficult for unskilled workers to find jobs</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Crime 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sustain the improved local policing, and prevent problem from replicating itself as factories move with development further out
