
Figure 1 Cycles Phonological Remediation Approach


Primary Potential Target Patterns

(For beginning cycles; target only those that are consistently deficient and stimulable.)



Secondary Potential Target Patterns

(After establishment of early developing patterns, contrastive use of velars/alveolars, /s/ cluster emergence in conversation, and suppression of gliding while producing liquids in carefully selected production-practice words, progress to secondary patterns that remain problematic; incorporate minimal pairs whenever possible.)
