'pidgin'

pidgin: a language containing lexical and other features from two or more languages, characteristically with simplified grammar and a smaller vocabulary than the languages from which it is derived, used for communication between people not having a common language; a lingua franca.

(OED)

'creole'

Creolization is the process by which one or more pidginized variants of a language (emerging from an initial multilingual contact situation...) are extended in domains of use and in the range of communicative and expressive functions they must serve. Frequently, but not necessarily, this process is associated with native use by children born into the contact situation. The pidginized variants are assumed to undergo complication and expansion of linguistic resources in the process, and the term creole may be used for any new stable variety that results from this process.
