

Ecological distribution	Forests and open places(1) 
Climate and elevation range	Middle to high elevations(1)
Local habitat and abundance	Common in moist woods and lower mountainous regions, and along roadsides. (3)
Plant characteristics	Small red fruits. Small white flowers with long stalks. (1)

PROPAGATION DETAILS

Propagation Method	Planted easily from rooted runners by layering or removing basal shoots, or you can take hardwood cuttings in late winter. (6)
Product Type	Seeds and stolons (8)

Target Specifications	The adult species are large in size and reach 16 m in height. Growing they develop a round-shape shrub. (5)
Growing Area Preparation / Annual Practices for Perennial Crops (growing media, type and size of containers, etc):	Once the cuttings have established roots, transplant to a regular potting soil and move to a greenhouse and place in a heavily shaded area. (7)
Active Growth Phase	Perennial (4)
Guidelines for Outplanting / Performance on Typical Sites	The best location for this shrub is a damp to wet site, sunny or shady. (6)
Other Comments (including collection restrictions or guidelines, if available):	Since this species has berries, most of the books that I looked at had information on what you could make with the berries and what the berries looked like. Nothing much on the propagation aspect.
