Cost:	16.25 Million USD
While supplying the local community with a	
center for primarily visual arts, this project draws	
from its historic U-shaped train warehouse by	
symbolically gesturing its form both outward and	
inward, a nod to the movement of trains as they	
constantly pull in and out of their stations. This	
large roof gesture provides a series of public	
and semi-public spaces while evoking a sense	
of 'grit' in its concrete structure that successfully	
contrasts yet relates to the historic train shed.
