Japanese Sentence

- Important thing to remember
 - Verb/Predicate comes at the end of a sentence
 - Verb/Predicate alone can make a sentence
- The copula
 - *Desu* (pronounced as “de-ssss”)
 - Noun+*desu*
 - Ohta desu. “I am Ohta.”
 - Sensee desu. “S/he is a teacher.”
 - 寿司desu. “It is sushi.”

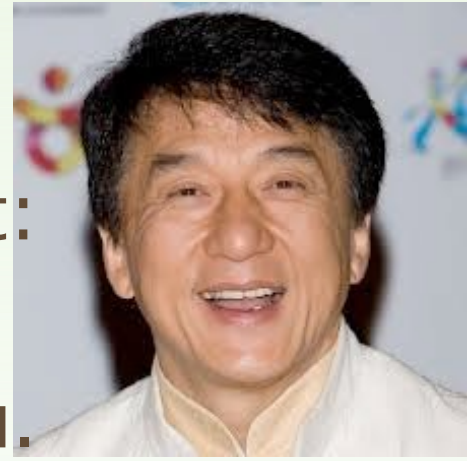

How to ask a question in Japanese? In conversation

- If you are already talking about something (say, nationality of a group of people).
- Following a statement about one person,
 - E.g. Obama-san wa Amerika jin desu.
 - Simply, (Jaa) _____ wa? (with a rising intonation)

How to ask a question in Japanese: question sentences formation

- If no preceding statement…
 - Attach か at the end of the sentence (with a rising intonation)
 - おおた sensee wa Nihon jin desu.
… declarative sentence
 - おおた sensee wa Nihon jin desu か。
… question sentence

How to answer the question?

- Yes (that's the case).
 - はい。 Or ええ。
 - はい、 soo desu/ええ soo desu.
- No (that's not the case).
 - いいえ。
 - いいえ、 soo ja arimasen.

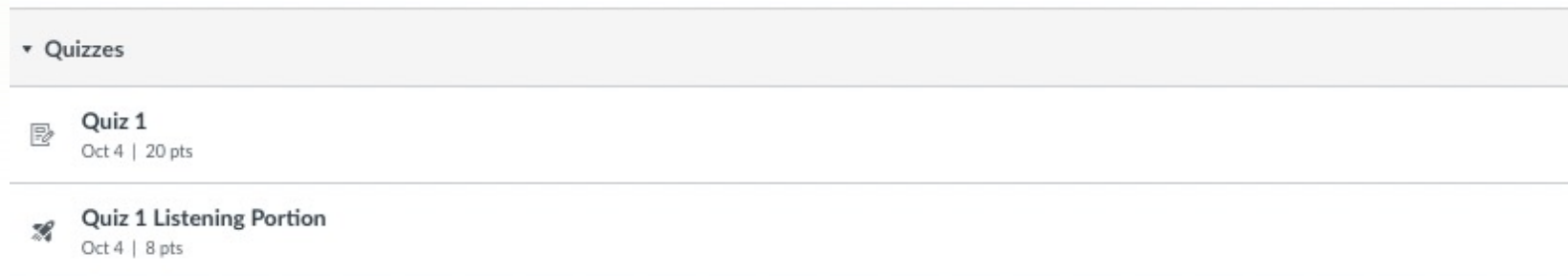
